
into the spirit which differentiates us from the rest.

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


Invest in the tradition of excellence.

Our school is in excellent shape. Our academic results are strong; we have dynamic leadership and a very good teacher-pupil ratio; achievements on the sports fields and across cultural activities are excellent; and the grounds and buildings are in magnificent condition.

The excellence we currently enjoy and can be proud of would not have been possible without the remarkable generosity of our old boys and other benefactors who believe education is key to our country's future.

Donations to the schools have made possible a broad range of developments: the world-class Mark Stevens aquatic centre; the (very symbolic) transformation of the old gymnasium into a library and museum; the Victor Daitz maths centre and hockey pavilion; the Rob Wray Pavilion with extensive gymnasium; the Barry Baars erg room; the purchase of a new rowing fleet; a multimedia centre in the prep school; two separate indoor cricket net facilities; new outdoor astro surface cricket nets which convert to hockey warm-up areas in winter, as well as new turf cricket nets next to School House; a floodlit hockey astro turf; renovations to the clock tower; a new parking area for prep teachers; refurbishment of the majority of the high school's classrooms; new classrooms at the prep school, replacing the pre-fabs; new Science Labs with an 'outdoor experiment' auditorium; a basketball complex; a single dining complex for boarders together with a state of the art kitchen; the upgrade of dormitories and all educator accommodation in the boarding houses; a borehole with a pop-up sprinkler system for the playing fields; new ladies



behind the current fund-raising campaign. We want to attract and retain the best teachers by increasing the amount of staff accommodation we can offer beyond the current 23, and to maintain the current staff-student ratio of 14:1. Infrastructure projects like a music centre and upgrades to the entrances of both schools are planned, with a very long wish list for additional facilities that would improve the school's educational experience. And we 110M want to continue being able to fund learners whose family circumstances prevent them from paying school 100M fees in full. 90M -

And, finally, we want to build up an endowment that will give our schools security into the future, so that they can weather any unexpected storms, and are in a position to take advantage of any opportunities that might arise The costs of the infrastructure projects alone over the past 10 years have exceeded R120 million. And

R120 million, in our 120th anniversary year, is the amount we aim to raise in the months ahead. Any contributions are welcomed, whether it is monetary, time devoted to flipping burgers, sending your sons to KEPS and KES, or just speaking well of the schools. We do have a wonderful story to tell of our past and our present, and want this to resonate into the future as well.

U23 World Champions, in the fastest time ever recorded by a U23 men's pair! Damien and Chris will be bringing home gold medals from the 2022 U23 Rowing World Championships held in Varese Italy in July. Improving on the 4th place they achieved at the 2018 Junior World Championships in Racice, Czech Republic, these athletes now have their sights set firmly on the Paris Olympics in 2024.

They have been rowing together for nearly a decade. Rowing first brought them together as schoolboys in U16 where they enjoyed the camaraderie and brotherhood of the King Edward VII School's Rowing Club and won every race they entered in their pair in their U16 and open years. Their partnership has continued to flourish on the international rowing stage, as members of the RMB National Squad.

Damien has an interest in logistics and is currently working parttime for a logistics company to support his rowing career while Chris works part-time as a financial advisor. These are areas of their lives which they are both passionate about.

But training for rowing is a full-time job in itself. Athletes in the RMB national squad train in excess of 24 hours per week and spend over 3 months of the year away from their training base at the University of Pretoria and Roodeplaat Dam.

Chris and Damien's path is focused on Paris 2024 and beyond, while still hoping to form partnerships with corporates in their respective financial and logistics field of work, to enable them to train full time but to also ensure a smooth transition to the working world when their sporting careers end. We look forward to watching their already remarkable rowing careers flourish at even greater heights!

Over the years TAG has grown tremendously, they now sponsor 38 boys and 9 young ladies at Parktown Girls High School.

I ultimately want to give back to the boys and girls that don't grow up with the same opportunities I have been given. Coming from a place of privilege and having a family who is extremely close I have been given the chance not many kids in South Africa have. Many young boys and girls grow up with single parents or with broken families. They have to fight for everything in life and I want to be the person who gives them their chance to reach their full potential. My campaign will be to raise enough money to financially support a boy through King Edward VII

School for five years. Boarding and School fees. This will mean I need to raise R700K. It takes a village to raise a child. I can't do this alone!

Every child deserves to dream, all it takes is an opportunity and for someone to believe in them. When doing some research, I spoke to a current TAG boy, and he had this to say "TAG Foundation to me is a family. The support is too much from all fronts whether it be sport or academic, and it just shows how much the foundation cares about us. The foundation keeps growing every year which is amazing. TAG is comforting, like the smiles we get when we see the people of TAG, Traci in particular when you greet her, her smile is so warm and eases the nerves, you feel like it is okay to be yourself. "Fun in the Sun" has soon become our mantra as every morning our little people come bounding in to school. Baby Bears opened its doors in January of this year with three classes and a total of 22 pupils. Over the past two terms we have grown to 30 pupils and in July we will start our 1-2-year-old class. Baby Bears is the perfect place to start any child's school career. There is one class of each age group (1-2, 2-3, 3-4 and 4-5) and we cater for both boys and girls. Our teachers are all qualified for their respective age groups and come with a wealth of experience.

Our programme is varied and stimulating and covers all the basic skills necessary for a preschool child. Gross motor and fine motor skills as well as perceptual and cognitive skills are taught daily. The programme also covers pre-literacy and pre-numeracy skills. Life skills as well as social and emotional development form an integral part of our every day.

Music is taught to the whole school on a weekly basis and this forms part of our rich syllabus. Teddy Cricket and Tumbling Tigerz are offered as extra murals.

Baby Bears is situated adjacent to King Edward VII Preparatory school at 1 Oak Street and our hours are from 07:00-17:30 daily during the school term. A holiday care programme is offered during the longer holidays at an extra cost. Our fees are in line with those of K.E.P.S. and includes breakfast, a midmorning snack, lunch, and an afternoon snack. Our classrooms are big, bright, and inviting and the children are attracted to the variety of activities on offer each day. Our playground is unique




